EPEDC 2021 Recap

As we look back on 2021, a year full of new challenges, Eastern Plains Economic Development Corporation continued to serve the people of Carter, Dawson, Fallon, Prairie and Wibaux Counties with renewed resolve to grow our economy. Our staff of economic and community development practitioners continued to assist local governments and organizations with infrastructure and funding and entrepreneurs with the business growth and start up needs. In 2021, EPEDC's grant writing resulted in \$1,050,095 of new grant funding for our communities. Some of the grants that we wrote and administrated this year included funding for the Swimming Pool Park in Wibaux, support for Friends of Makoshika for an outdoor projector system and a CBDG Planning Grant to update the City of Baker's Zoning Regulations.

In addition to the new grant funding that EPEDC secured for our cities, counties, businesses and nonprofits, we also worked tirelessly on providing grant administration for projects that had received grant funding previously. Some of the projects that we administrated this year included the Montana Avenue Water Main Replacement Project in Baker, a Preliminary Engineering Report and Feasibility Study for Irrigation in the Fallon Flats and the new Dahl Memorial Healthcare Facility. EPEDC administrated \$5,972,145 of grant funds, which represents \$26,352,253 total project costs that EPEDC managed. We hosted 11 different trainings throughout the five counties and via Zoom. Many of these trainings were co-hosted with other community partners and showed just how important collaboration is for small business success.

EPEDC provides free and confidential counseling regarding all aspects of business start-up and business expansion, including planning and troubleshooting. Providing Technical Assistance to businesses and nonprofits is a big part of what we do. In 2021, we assisted 146 businesses and nonprofits.

We look forward to what 2022 has to hold for us and for the region that we serve.

EPEDC is on track to host just as many trainings in 2022, with different topics and some of the same.

While these trainings are geared towards nonprofits businesses are welcome to participate, they will be going over mass email services, website options, content design services and more.

During their eastern tour of the state MNA will once again be providing different workshops while in the region. Previous trainings have been Board Governance and Next Gen Leadership. We are working on dates for these training and possibly others through MNA. We will once again be hosting two Excel Trainings one beginner and one intermediate class, both via Zoom.
